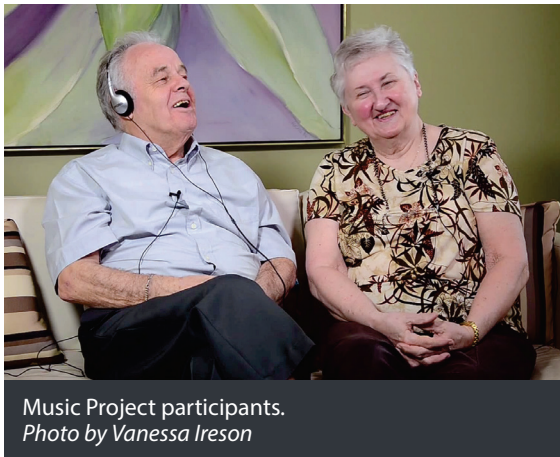

ABOUT

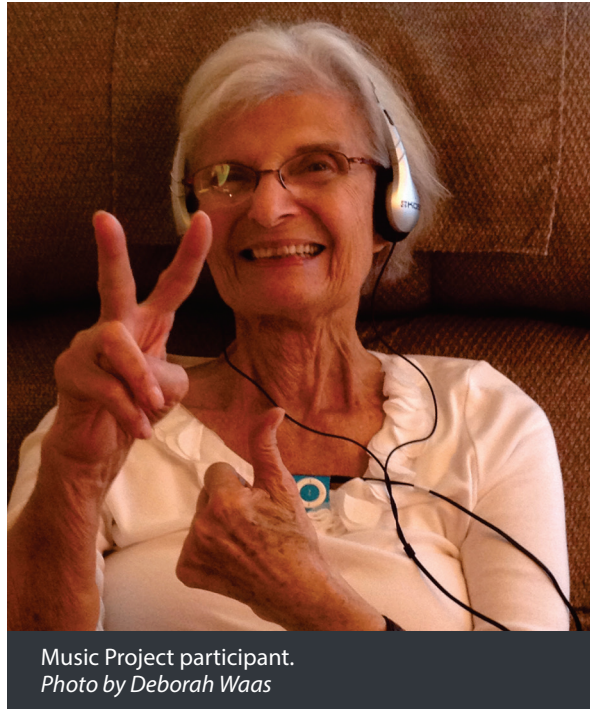
The Alzheimer Society Music Project uses the power of music to bring joy into the lives of people living with dementia. The program reconnects people with “the soundtrack of their lives” by providing participants with a personalized music player loaded with their favourite music. In addition to a music player, participants also receive over-the-ear headphones and a wall charger that allows charging without a computer.

The Alzheimer Society Music Project is available FREE of cost to all eligible participants.

BENEFITS

While the response to personalized music will be unique to each individual, listening to personalized music has the power to increase physical and social activity; reignite older memories; and improve mood, sleep, cognition, communication, and overall quality of life.

HOW TO APPLY

There are several ways to apply to the program.

1. **Online:** Visit www.musicproject.ca.
2. **Over the phone:** Call your local participating Alzheimer Society listed on www.musicproject.ca.
3. **In-person:** Ask an Alzheimer Society staff or a referring organization (e.g. long-term care home, retirement residence, etc.) that is registered with the Alzheimer Society Music Project.

FAQS

1. Is the Music Project appropriate only for people in the early stages of dementia?

The Alzheimer Society Music Project has shown to be beneficial in every stage of dementia.

2. What are the eligibility criteria?

Criteria may vary by region. Please contact your local participating Alzheimer Society to determine your eligibility for the program.

3. Are you able to provide culturally-specific music?

Yes! Our music library is constantly expanding to include soundtracks from all genres, decades, cultures, religions, and languages to serve our diverse population.

4. Do I need a computer to participate?

No. We will set up and load your music player with music based on your selection during the application process and will provide a wall charger.

5. How long can I keep the music player?

Once a music player is issued to a music recipient, it is theirs to keep for as long as they want, even if they change their place of residence. We do request that clients return music players when they are no longer in use.

6. How can I support the Alzheimer Society Music Project?
